As Institute M3 enters its second year we are glad to report on current activities.

The Institute is presently engaged in researching a publication relating to the city of New Haven in the twentieth century. Primarily this will comprise a written and graphic record of the City's accomplishments with some view of its probable future in the regional context. Assistance will be asked of numerous individuals and agencies maintaining pertinent information.

A second and important project concerns the attempt to preserve a small but unique Adirondacks lake being threatened by the construction of what the New York State Department of Transportation terms a highway "corridor". Support in this effort is being solicited from a variety of sources. Already the New York Chapter of the Sierra Club has indicated its willingness to render assistance technically. But more is needed. This spring current plans are to mount a campaign to "Save Eagle Lake", a most worth-while goal and undertaking.

Other concerns of Institute M3 involve preservation and energy conservation. It is our intent to work closely with an organization called REEF (Regional Energy Efficiency Force) in the coming months. Nor is the Institute losing sight of certain primary initiatives: how best to combat the present alarming trend toward nuclear proliferation, as well as increasing reliance on nuclear power. We welcome support from whatever source in all these and related interests.
