My dear Flint:-

Your letter of May 30th to hand. While the guarantee of \$100.00, which Mr. Hurd and I proposed to you, was to be paid only after you succeeded in getting an order from the Supreme Court, compelling Newton to restore the conditions at Eagle Lake as they were before prior to Sept 1st 1913. I induced Mr. Hurd to join me in advancing you this guaranteed fee.

Mr. Runge has advised me that in accordance with my request, he has paid you \$25.00 on our guarantee of the \$100.00, and Mr Hurd and I, each, inclose you herewith \$25.00 making altogether \$75.00 of the total amount. With \$25.00 paid you by the Farmer's Loan & Trust Co., as their share, you will have received the whole amount under our guarantee.

I have no positive information whether Mr Lodge will contribute any thing toward this action, will know better when I can see him in person.

I well realize that you have put in much time in correspondence etc, as chairman and you can well understand that, in my capacity as Secretary, I have also done a great deal of work and without any prospect of recompense.

In fact, though the changed conditions at the Lake, through Newton's act, will affect my riparian structures less than those of other property owners, I have taken the initiative, both in work and contribution, unselfishly, for the good of all concerned.

For the reasons stated to you in my previous letter, it will be impossible for me to sign any affidavits that you may need.

I am sure you can get the necessary affidavits without mine and Hurd's.

Trusting that the remittances will now enable you to proceed without further delay and wishing you complete victory in the case, I am,
