## PUBLIC NOTICE

Notice is hereby given that, pursuant to Article V, Part III-A of the Conservation Law and the Rules and Regulations for Issuance of Permits under said Law (6 NYCRR Part 611), the Water Resources Commission will cause a public hearing to be held in the Auditorium, Ticonderoga Community Building, Montcalm Street, Ticonderoga, on the 9th day of July, 1969, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon of that day for the purpose of:

- (a) hearing all persons, corporations or civil divisions of the State of New York that may be affected by the exeuction of the plans of Harland H. Stubing to place sand fill along 150 feet of his shorefront property and extending 15 feet into Eagle Lake and place riprap slope protection on the fill in Eagle Lake, Town of Ticonderoga, Essex County, plans for which have been filed with the Division of Water Resources, Conservation Department, and are now in its office in Albany, N.Y., and also in the Regional Office of Fish and Game at Ray Brook, where the same are open for public inspection; and
- (b) determining whether said plans provide for the proper and safe construction of all work connected therewith, and whether execution of the proposal would adversely affect the health, safety and welfare of the people of the State or the natural resources of the State.

All persons, corporations or civil divisions of the State of New York, other than the applicant and parties in interest who have filed in accordance with the prior "Notice of Application" published in this matter who have objections to the execution of said plans or wish to be heard either in favor of or opposed to such plans, in order to be heard thereon, must file a notice of such desire to be heard in writing, and in duplicate, in the office of the Commission in the City of Albany, New York, on or before the 8th day of July, 1969. Any objection so filed must particularly specify the grounds thereof.
