My dear Mr. Lodge:-

I have your letter of the 11th. inst.

Some time since I received a communication from Mr. Peter Flint, in which he wanted to know whether the Eagle Lake Improvement Company was about to institute proceedings and if not, whether our corporation would unite with those whom Mr. Flint represents in such a proceeding. I answered Mr. Flint under date of the 22nd. ult., asking him what legal doctrine he expected to invoke in his proceeding, and what was the nature of that proceeding. I have not heard from him in answer to this inquiry, and I shall not be surprised if I do not hear from him for some time to come.

I do not think that it will be the easiest thing for him or any other lawyer clearly to indicate how any legal right to have the dam kept up can be established and enforced. There may be a way to do it, but I do not yet see how.

Messrs. Newton & Ferris promised me in the winter to make a proposition to us in regard to this dam. I have spoken to them several times about it since, but the proposition is not forthcoming. I can not ascertain from them what price they will sell the lot for or anything about it. I think that we may as well let the matter rest until you come up on the 19th. inst.
