Gentlemen:

I wish to protest the application #5-4-69 of Harland H. Stubing for a permit to construct cribbing and fill in the waters of Eagle Lake where I own property and have a camp on the north shore of the Lake. I am also a member of the Conservation Forum of Buffalo, New York where I have a residence.

If Mr. Stubing is permitted to enlarge his property by filling in part of Eagle Lake what is going to stop all of us from enlarging our property that way and building camps on the fill? This is the toe-hold which we on the Lake wish to prevent. Also, Mr. Stubing has a barroom on his property on Eagle Lake which has adequate parking facilities right now. If enlarged it means that much more noise on the lake, that many more accidents on the Chilson Hill Road and that many more beer cans thrown into the lake which float down and rest on the property of all the owners at the east end of the Lake, including the Beach owned by the State.

This has always been a nice residential little lake and we want to keep it that way. Please consider my protest as well as others you have received very seriously - I am sure you want to see the Adirondacks kept beautiful as much as we do.
