RE: EAGLE LAKE DAM

Gentlemen:

The results of the balloting on the water level of Eagle Lake are in, and the voting was forty-nine (49) yes, and sixteen (16) no on the proposition, a copy of which is attached. The vote favored the lower water level of four inches below the pin. The gauge at the bridge now reads two inches (2) above the pin. Eighty-seven ballots were mailed out, and sixty-five replied.

We all know that there has been a lot of interest shown in this matter and you have received input from both sides. Maybe we can arrive at a happy medium by the time the dam is constructed, especially if a gate is installed.

The Eagle Lake Property Owners Association originated in 1898, with annual meetings in the form of picnics at private homes. It was formally organized in 1907 and has been active ever since in maintaining and protecting the waters of Eagle Lake and the property surrounding it.

Eagle Lake is a small lake, as you know, and has long been a very quiet lake with clean water, even potable at most times. Recent acidity and bacteriologic tests were very favorable. However, there is a limit to how much gasoline, oil, road salt, deisel exhaust fumes, and other toxic wastes that it can absorb. Anything that you can do to protect the waters of Eagle Lake and maintain the status quo will be deeply appreciated by our members.

We sincerely appreciate the work, efforts and co-operation that you have given us on this matter and look forward to seeing the dam completed to the satisfaction of all concerned.
