on the town airport. The town board heard a request from Paul Fosco, Park avenue, to have the town form a water district. Fosco stated that he had been to the village board and they had told him to come to the town board with his petition and request for a water district. Fosco said there was a total of

12 homes in the area in which he was speaking about. Of this 12, there were 4 which were trailers. He said that he owned two lots in the area and that without water could not move to the site he

The procedures on how to apply for a water district were explained in general. Town attorney Gerald Lawson told Fosco that he would have within the week a written procedure on how he should proceed to form a water district in

proceed to form a water district in the Park avenue area, The town board heard a request from C.A. Belkevich, Troy, and Eagle Lake, to allow for a variance on his property so he could place a trailer. The town board at their August meeting had rejected an application by Belkevich on the trailer, because it had been placed without a permit, and according to available permit, and according to available information at that time, the board felt that the request should not be granted.
