My dear Lushy,

Just received a letter from Mr. Flint in which he says he has a letter from the Amer. Steel & Wire Co. in which they said they sent you check for \$20. Naturally Flint would like the money and I would suggest that you send it to him to cover his expenses & agreement. As he already wrote me there is due \$10 for typewriting (he must have done quite some) and then \$10 still due on the \$20 promised. so he sent me the check which I shall  
keep or deposit here in Flushing. I  
certainly shall not send it to Flint at
