Dear Sir:

On August 19, 1931, this Commission approved the water supply application which had been filed by the village of Ticonderoga under the provisions of Article XIII of the Conservation Law. The project thus approved contemplated the use of Gooseneck and Rock ponds as new and additional sources of water supply for that village.

Since that time, further investigation with regard to Rock pond has been made by this Commission and by the State Department of Health.

On October 31, 1931, the State Department of Health advised this Commission that in its opinion the water of Rock pond was not only unfit but was dangerous for human consumption and therefore recommended that the use of that pond as a source of water supply be not permitted. A copy of this letter is appended.

The Commission will consider this matter at its next meeting, the date for which has not at this moment been set.

In case the officials of the village of Ticonderoga wish to be heard with regard to this recommendation of the Health Commissioner, the undersigned will hold a hearing in this office on Friday, November 6, 1931 at 2:00 o'clock in the afternoon.
