Dear Tom:

I am enclosing the Instant pictures which I took the morning of August 28th, showing how our "slien beings" floated to the top and clumped on Eagle Lake immediately following an all-night rain storm. The pictures aren't too clear because it was still dark and the temperature was not the best for the proper development of the Instant film. None the less, it will give you the idea of what it looked like. You are looking at them from about six feet over the water, into a depth of about three feet, and you are seeing a rock formation on the bottom.

Later the same day, these things dispersed and were like you had seen them earlier. This floating and clumping was noted again after another rain storm. The only expalnation I could come up with was that there was a water temperature change which might have caused this to occur.

I appreciate what you are doing for us, and I hope that you come up with some answers.

As a reminder, you were going to send me information not only about the formation of a water district, but also about the training, etc., of some local residents to check the pollution possibilities of the septic systems around the lake.
