Dear Mr. Luthy:

I thank you for your personal vote of confidence in suggesting that the Eagle Lake minnow stocking program be put in my charge. The idea of handling it that way had not occurred to me and at first I thought I could not afford to spend the extra time such a plan would require. On further consideration, however, I believe it can be handled that way with very little extra time spent on my part. I am, therefore, ready to fall in with your suggestion, if it meets with the agreement of the other members of your Association.

The first step in the program is a trip to Eagle Lake to settle upon the best place for screening and placing the fish. If the ice is out of the lake by that time, I should like to take this trip on the 10th of April. I am hoping that you can put me in touch with some one, preferably a member of your Association, who is familiar with the lake and can act as a guide on that occasion. If there is no one available for such a function, I shall do the best I can alone or with one of the members of the survey who worked on the lake last summer.
