Dear Mr. Greene:-

I have just received your letter of March 22d and am pleased to hear that my suggestion for you to handle the minnow-stocking experiment at Eagle Lake yourself meets with your approval and that you can arrange to do this.

I received the consent and agreement of the majority of the members of our Association and you may proceed with the project, in accordance with the estimated list of expense which you submitted in your letter of Feb'y 4th 1933.

Since you are contemplating to make the trip on April 10th to Eagle Lake to familiarize yourself with the lake & surroundings to enable you to select a place for screening, after you have been there please write me what amount of the estimated expense you will need and I will send you a P.O. Money order so that, after the ice is out of the lake, you can proceed with planting the minnows.

I have arranged to put you in contact with Mr. Rupert Wickes of Ticonderoga, N.Y. He is the son of one of the local members of our Association and has promised to direct you to the lake and can give you such information as you may need. When you reach Ticonderoga village call at the office of Mess. Wickes and Wickes, attorneys, 2d floor of the Bank Building on West Exchange St. and inquire for Mr. Rupert Wickes. You can arrange with him to guide you to and around the lake. May I suggest that you advise him in advance of your coming, say a few days ahead. I have written him to the above effect and I am sure he will cheerfully assist you and give you any information you may need.
