My dear Mr. Lodge:- Your recent letter copy of deed of
Newton was duly received. Since then I have had a
letter from Mr. Flint, giving his advise & suggestions as to procedure,
which I understand he communicated to you. I have written
several members & they together with me concluded that we
~~had best~~ should do as Mr. Flint advised viz:- appeal to the
Supreme Court to order & direct Newton & Sons to ~~remove the~~
replace the spillover of the dam & restore the old water ~~level~~
of Eagle Lake, to its former height, and to get a permanent
 injunction restraining the furthering of the lake on which this
dam is built from ever changing that level without
consent of a majority of the property owners.

In this connection I should suggest that the advisory
Board of our Association ratify such action & Lincoln
resolution authorizing the T. Pres. to proceed which as soon
as you receive the signatures, I would advise that
you immediately instruct Mr. Flint to enter action.

Mr. Flint advises that the cost of this action, including
his fee will be -

As all our members are interested alike in having the
old water level restored, it appears in justice to all that
this expense be paid out of the ass. funds, especially so
as if the Court orders Mr. & Sons to remove the dam
our ass. will not need to reconstruct it as contemplated.

I do not know what position you are in with Mr.
Witter but if you have obliged yourself in any way with him
it might be well to have him & Mr. Flint meet & discuss the action.
However I would have an understanding beforehand, with Mr. Witter as
well as Flint as to the total cost of such action -

Those with whom I conversed were anxious now
to appeal to the Court, as outlined herein before and I
believe we ought lose no time for this action, after
you receive the signatures of the Advisory Board to
the Resolution for action.

The Grand Bend & others seem to have suffered
more by the lowering of the water of the Lake than
the rest at the middle & East end of the Lake, & they
therefore prefer having the water restored to the former
level.
