In order to inspire the respect of our Association and to protect the cottages and camps of our members from invasion, pillage, theft, vandalism, etc. the Secretary shall hereby be authorized at any time, upon request of any member or advertising who may present such request in writing FOR apprehension by the amount of the reward APPREHENSION which such member determines to offer & CONVICTION and provided said member agrees to OF PERSONS pay the cost of advertising said reward, ENTERING to publish or have posted or both as COTTAGES may be requested, a reward for the OR CAMPS apprehension & conviction of any person OF MEMBERS or persons who may have broken into, entered or invaded or committed theft, burglary or larceny in the cottage or camp of any member; the purpose of this resolution being to serve such notice of reward under the name of the Association rather than in the name of the individual member suffering the invasion, theft or pilferage.

IN RE - POLLUTION OF WATERS OF EAGLE LAKE

8TH ANNUAL MEETING AUG 20/15 The property owners members individually & collectively strive to prevent the pollution of the waters of Eagle Lake by informing any camp or any person who throws garbage or any other offensive and

destructive matter in the lake, that this Association will report any such offense to the Conservation Commission.

The Sec'y. Treas. is however authorized to enforce this resolution by reporting any offender, without further action, of the Association & is also authorized to post the Lake with the above notices if found necessary.

RESOLUTION ON DISTRESS SIGNAL.

ADOPTED

AUG 7/1926

Resolved that this Association adopt a "Distress Signal," to be used in case of necessity by its members, to be given by firing three shots in rapid succession which may be repeated at intervals of a few minutes. These shots to be authenticated by displaying at the place of distress, a lighted lamp placed near the shoreline or where easiest visible at night, or by a flag hoisted at half mast or with the stars down in the daytime and any member hearing a distress call should respond to the relief of the one distressed.
