Thank you for your kind note of December 27th.


I wrote a letter, similar to the one I sent you, to all the residents of the North side of Eagle Lake and to Mr. Ruck, thinking that you all might use Eagle Lake water for washing or drinking. I do not know the names of the owners, (other than Mr. Ruck), on the South side, across the viaduct, so I couldn't single them out for letters.

Dave Warren, the present president, has been carrying on further correspondence relative to this problem, with the result that an increase in phosphorous content definitely does seem to be the culprit. However, in talking with the State people about this, they feel that the present New York State laws regarding low phosphate detergents should cover the low population on Eagle Lake satisfactorily. However, although the content might not get higher, it probably will not get too much lower. Therefore, it would be best to try to maintain an even lower input of phosphates than are allowed in the present detergents.

The prime target now, however, should be to check all the septic systems around the Lake to assure proper percolation, and to see that no pollutants are going directly into the Lake. The State man has offered to train, (at no charge), a couple of our residents to do it, and has told us that the cost of the chemicals would be about \$5.00 for a ten year's supply. So this would not cost anything but some resident's time. I am for getting some local summer people to do it, rather than the out-landers such as we are. Dave Warren is now looking into that, and hopefully, we can get a program going by the second week in July.

I think this is essential!!
