I imagine, of course, that it would be necessary to get the unanimous consent of the property-owners to raising the present virgin level, and to agree upon a level

satifactory to all.

However, whatever you two decide upon doing in the matter I will cooperate with you on any consistent

water-level, and if the proposition meets with your approval, to proceed with it, together for its accomplishment.

As you well know, it will be most important to know in advance under whose jurisdiction the dam will be, who will have to maintain and control it and that the water-level must not be raised and lowered at will beyond the agreed level
