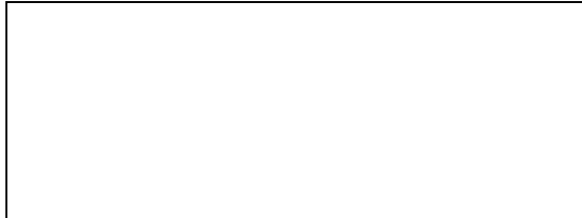
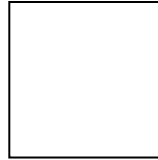

Membership Application/Renewal Form Instructions.

Property Dues/Membership (Lake Property Owners Only):

An annual \$25.00 Property Due is required for each lake property. This due once paid provides that lake property with a single vote. If there are multiple owners of the property, only one person needs to pay the \$25.00 property due. During all voting opportunities, only one vote per property will be counted, regardless of multiple owners. However, by paying the dues, all owners of that property will have full Membership. If there are multiple owners of a property more than one name and associated contact information can be included in our database, this is so that all interested parties can receive ELPOI mailings, but again only one person can vote. If those other owners want to make a financial contribution to support the efforts of the ELPOI they can do so by being an associate or just making a donation. If you own multiple lake properties, then you will receive an additional vote for each lake property that you pay dues for. ALL memberships run July 1 to June 30 of the following year, so at this point all memberships need to be renewed.

Associate Membership (Non-Owners):

An associate membership is \$15.00 and is for people who are either family, friends, a second owner named on the property deed or other interested parties who have a vested interest in preserving Eagle Lake for future generations and want to receive ELPOI communications.

What your dues cover:

Your membership dues and all other contributions to Eagle Lake Property Owners, Inc., are tax deductible under rules governing not-for-profit 501(c)3 status. With your membership dues we try to cover a multitude of services including: beaver control, lake level management, annual lake water testing by both CSLAP (analytical) and additional non-CSLAP (fecal) entities, donations to local emergency services, as well as many other items, full details are in the treasures report given at the annual meeting and posted at eaglelake1.org. 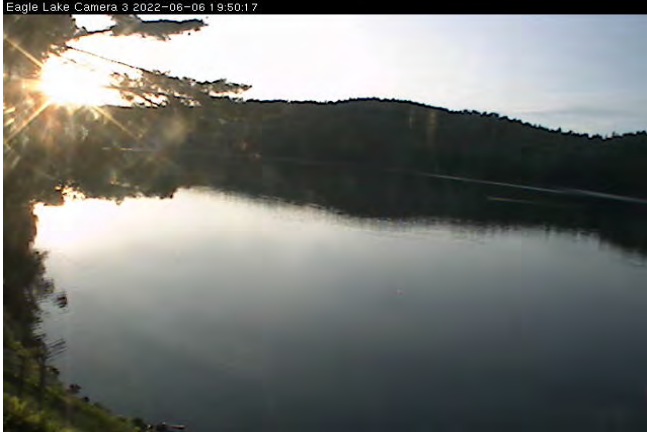

Our Annual Membership Meeting will be held at the Chilson Community Center on Putts Pond Road on **July 9, 2022 at 10am**. We encourage your presence and will follow current Covid guidelines in place at the time of the event. This will be an open air, outdoor event, social distancing can easily be practiced here due to the space we have available, masks will be optional for those that feel they need them. If you cannot attend but would like to have your voice count, see the renewal page for options for a proxy vote. Also, for those that cannot attend an audio recording will be available in late summer on the ELPOI website. A Porta-Potty will be provided by the CVFD. We plan to have lunch after the meeting. Lake Level & Beavers -

The lake level is within the normal range of +/- 4" of the zero mark on the bridge. As of this writing the level is +3". The boards were installed in late April and the debris from beavers has been removed from the spillway as needed. Unfortunately, all the beavers were not removed at the end of last season. There are still one or more on the loose. We are on the schedule with the trapper but as of now he has not been on site to remedy the issues. Thanks to our team of "dam volunteers", Dave Cerny, Deb and Jack Mulcahy, Zack Dorfman and Bill Zito. Anyone wishing to join may contact any Officer or Board Member. A waiver, found under archive/ permits on the ELPOI site, must be filled out to work in the dam area. Treasurer's report regarding membership -

This past year's membership count is above the previous years. Sixty of our lake residents joined this past year to support the mission of the ELPOI to monitor and protect our mutual interest in the lake's water quality. Five businesses and six associates' members also joined in this effort. To date \$2,500 was deposited and we thank all those that joined/ paid their dues and made additional contributions. But on this note, in the past two years ELPOI has seen income revenue drop from \$4,000 to the current level of \$2,500. With this year's current expenditures of \$2,000 for water testing, beaver control, donations to local service organizations and a few other miscellaneous expenditures, we will for the first time in decades have just enough income to cover expenditures.

The three caveats that are related to this are that in 2021 we had a significant expense related to beaver removal, that ELPOI has not done any in-house fundraising events such as glassware or tee shirts in the past few years, and in years past International Paper, now Sylvamo, has provided us with a grant. We have been in contact with the Mill's Communications Director and have been told that when the RFP (request for proposals) is released we will be one of the first on the notifications list. Sylvamo's hope is to release the RFPs by 1 July. On the bright side ELPOI has been able to, over the past few years, build a cash reserve and our bank account balance is \$20,000. There is also ELPOI members' monies (from reimbursement of the NYS DEC 2007 milfoil project grant) available for invasives monitoring and control (or other expenditures as voted on), sitting in a bank account managed by the Town of Crown Point. These funds total \$34,500.

Note: The ELPOI fiscal year runs July 1 to June 30. So that means all membership renewals need to be made in June or early July, if you want to participate in any discussions and decisions made at the Annual Meeting. New Boating Law -



All watercraft, powered and non-powered, need to be cleaned, drained and dried if they are to be transiently used between water bodies.

On June 8th of this year a new law will come on line asking for certification that ALL watercraft and recreational water equipment (i.e. fishing gear, scuba equipment, tow tube's, etc.) and almost anything that can and is used in the water, be Cleaned, Drained and Dried (C,D&D). The new law requires all operators of motorized and NON motorized watercraft to obtain certification that they have cleaned, drained, and dried their boats and equipment each time they launch into a NEW waterbody in the Adirondack Park and within [10 miles of the Blue Line \(PDF\)](#). Note: the C, D&D rule only

applies to boats that are transitory to different water bodies- if you take out and put back into the **same** water body you do not need to implement the C, D&D procedure. However, at the moment it is our interpretation of the new law that you will have to have on the watercraft or with the recreational equipment a "Certificate of Compliance ". When an aquatic invasive species inspection station adjacent to a public waterbody is open for operation, watercraft operators can receive a watercraft inspection certificate from a boat steward by accepting a free boat inspection or decontamination. Alternately, boaters may follow Clean, Drain, Dry steps on their own and fill out a [self-issued certificate \(PDF\)](#) available on the DEC's website. There are numerous locations inside and outside the Blue Line where these boat inspections can be completed, see the DEC website before launching. [Boat stewards](#) will be stationed at popular boat launches across the Adirondack Park and can be identified by their blue vests. Click the link for locations and more information.

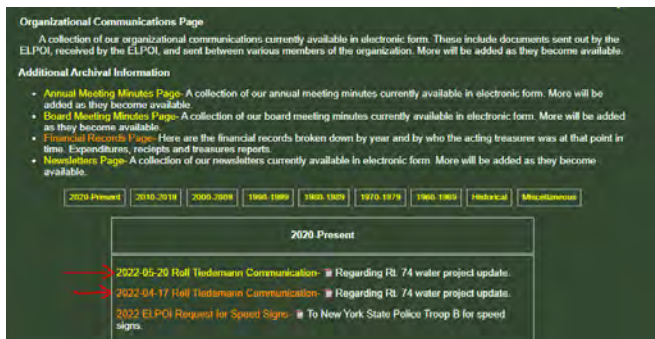

Travelers from the west can stop at the wash on Rt 74 near the bridge over the Schroon River. Travelers from the East can go to the wash at the Ticonderoga launch on Lake Champlain.

Gooseneck Water -

Our Treasure Rolf T. has sent out as a courtesy and as a messenger, several email blasts over the past few weeks as information of the Eagle Lake Rt 74 section of the Gooseneck water project has become available. This information was gleaned from residents that attended the Town meeting and shared feedback, or from the Town’s web page itself.

If you did not get an email copy of this information it’s because your email is not in our database. Please check with a neighbor for specific details or see the emails on the ELPOI website at <http://eaglelake1.org/html/archives/communications.shtml> and see the following image for specifics to which files.



As of now the Town is saying the current proposal is “too expensive” and there may be no option for wet fire hydrants in the Rt 74 EL corridor. This being said and if the DOT (see Causeway section) does not include a dry hydrant at the causeway residents may find themselves personally without drinking water but also without any source for fire or emergency response water.

ELPOI and the water district -

The ELPOI’s mission does not directly cover any issues related to the Gooseneck water project. The mission of ELPOI is specific to covering lake water quality issues. The information provided above about the water system is provided by those volunteers that have attended meetings, have asked questions for their personal knowledge and have the interest to share it with us. Please direct any questions to them or directly to the

Town Supervisor. If you have any information to share, please direct it to one of the ELPOI officers.

Water Testing -



On a brisk but beautiful mid-September 2021 morning, sample collector Chris and boat operator Rolf collected fecal water test samples from 5 locations around

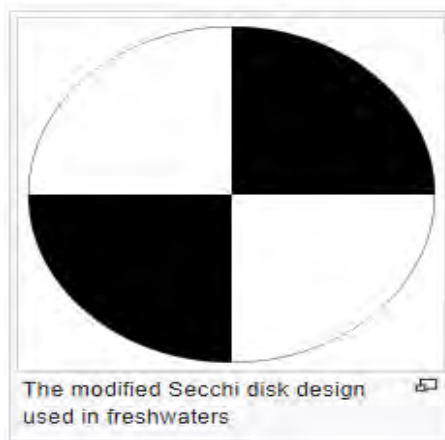
the lake. Chris then quickly delivered them to a lab in Ballston Spa. In order for samples to be valid they need to be collected and analyzed in a timely manner and need to be at the lab by noon. Results are available on our website at eaglelake1.org, look for the archives tab and scroll to the bottom of the list for water quality reports. Results for this year’s tests are the same as past years with only very small amounts of fecal matter being detected at a few locations. The tests cannot discriminate between human and bird, etc.. With this said the lake continues to be suitable for our recreational endeavors.

CSLAP water testing -



ELPOI volunteers continued this year to collect and pre-process 8 bi-monthly water samples for the Citizens Statewide Lake Assessment Program. This program, in cooperation with NSFOLA and the DEC, provides chemical and analytical observations for lake water quality. Eagle Lake has been sending samples for the past 21 years. The latest report indicates only minor fluctuations in the observed data over this time period, most relating to water clarity and temperature - observations for all other analyticals have been stable. All previous reports are available on the ELPOI website under archives/ water quality reports/ CSLAP. T., taken with his drone. This test has the observer lower a weighted black and white disk into the water column until the disk's white black pattern can't be seen. At this point the depth is recorded as the "secchi depth". Eagle lake's water averages a secchi depth of 5 to 8 meters, very deep or clear compared to many other lakes in the Park that have depths of 1/2 meter to 2 meters. The shallower ranges can be due to spring pollen in the air falling and mixing in the water column or heavy rains or high water and the erosion that is caused by either. Tree or leaf tannin can also affect the depth seen. If you see the boat pictured above anchored just slightly north and west of Conklin's "the big island" on a bright sunny weekend morning, please give them some space as they are collecting lake samples. As of this writing 2 samples have already been collected for the 2022 season.

Route 74 Radar Speed Sign -



The Town of Ti once again honored our request for a light-up speed sign along Route 74. It was deployed a few weeks prior to the Memorial Day weekend and hopefully the Town will be able to leave it there through 4th of July. The request for its deployment also asked for intermittent

radar patrols by the New York State Police, the County Sheriffs and the Ti Police. A New York State Police Officer while on duty one day was verbally thanked for his patrol. Written thank you notes have been sent to all involved parties along with requests for them to continue the monitoring/ enforcement in 2022-23. Remember that we too must comply, and if we get stopped, we have only ourselves to blame. Due to the narrowness of Route 74 the officers patrolling often find it difficult to find a place to park for their patrols. As a request, if you would not mind having a patrol use your driveway for this, please let Keith P. know by email (officer@eaglelake1.org) or letter (ELPOI, C/O Keith Park, 31 Barkwood Ln., Clifton Park, NY 12065) and he can forward this on to the officers, as they need written permission to utilize private property for this. Causeway Project 2022-2023 -

The new bridge will be located in the same location as the existing culvert and will consist of a prefabricated design with pre-cast concrete and a 20'-30' wide "below the roadbed" opening with approximately the same height/clearance as what we currently have. Some minor road widening may occur around the bridge itself but most of the causeway approach roadbed will remain untouched. There had been discussions with DOT the Town and Chilson VFD related to installing a Dry Hydrant during construction. **In the latest conversations with the DOT it appears that this will not take place, due to cost and logistical reasons.**

The project will commence in the Fall of 2022 with preliminary site preparation and installation of micro piles to support the new Bridge. During this phase of the construction traffic will be reduced to one alternating lane with temporary traffic lights controlling traffic.

Traffic would be returned to 2 lanes for the winter of 2022-23. Spring 2023 Construction would resume in April and the installation of the new bridge would take place. This would happen over a 72-hour period with complete closure of the roadway, likely over a weekend prior to Memorial Day. Detours would be set up on Route 8 to the south and "as yet to be determined" to the North. The plan is to have the project completed prior to Memorial Day Weekend in 2023. (Notes taken from DOT meeting by Keith P.)



P.S. The difference between a culvert and a bridge is defined by its length of span, in our case the length distance over the water. The reason this is important here comes down to funding, there are federal funds available to fix/ install bridges but none for culverts. Hence, we are getting a "bridge".
