Points we discussed and agreed might form a part of a request for Dam at outlet of Eagle Lake.

1. The State owns all the land at the outlet of the lake.
2. In the fall of 1932 the village of Treadroga, with permission from the N.Y. Conservation Commission diverted all the waters of Gooseneck Pond which were tributary to Eagle Lake resulting in a lowering of the water level.
3. About that time the last remnant of a very old dam was taken out rendering further to lower the water in the lake.
4. The State has for years been locking the lake with fish weed. It is generally agreed the water is now so low as to destroy the natural spawning beds.
5. Before the village of Treadroga was permitted to take the water from Gooseneck Pond a meeting ^{attended by} of the majority of the property owners unananimously passed a resolution of protest on the ground that the withdrawal of so much inflow of water would damage our lake.
6. There is great need for a dam that will stabilize a level not above necessarily above the normal

level of three years ago. Such a dam would injure no one. It would not be expensive and with a wide spillway it would allow rapid over flow in the spring and retain the water at a given level during the summer.

It should have to be built on state land and we request the Conservation Commission to take the necessary steps to have it built.
