

MINUTES OF FIFTH ANNUAL MEETING OF THE Langue Chinoise Missionary Society

Fredrik... Eagle Lake, Esmeralda Co., Nev. - Aug. 17, 1912

The fifth annual meeting of the Eagle (Cheson) Lake
Proprietary Owners' Association was held on Aug 17th 1912,
at Cedarhurst Cottage on Eagle Lake, Essex Co., N.Y.
was called to order by Pres. Artz general at 4 P.M.
and read unanimous to notices of said meeting
being given back to the members in accordance with
Art. V, Sect. 1 of the By-Laws of the Association.

On motion of the President duly made & carried Mr. Peter Flint was duly elected to act as temporary Secretary-Treas. in place of the deceased ^{Ex} Secretary who was absent abroad.

At the recent meeting of the following
members were enrolled as present viz:—President Mr. S. J. Gandy,
Wm. C. Wicks, Lodge, Cutkin, Stein, Hens & Haenning,
and Mrs. M. J. Schmidlepp, all present in person and
In Safety, represented by proxy in hands of Past. S. J. Gandy.
His enrollment constituting a quorum making
the meeting competent to proceed with its
business.

The Secretary pro tem. then read the minutes of the last meeting & the same were upon motion duly made carried, adjourned.

Mr. Stein as Chairman of Committee on Fisheries
then read his report on the causes ^{leading to}
the continued scarcity of game fish in Eagle
Lake, showing that same was largely due

the lake during high water in spring time & the necessity of placing some observation there for the prevention of such future loss. The report contains the information about Mr. Fletcher M. Dean.

Report of Fisheries in Conservation Communities at
Albion, after learning about local conditions,
had strongly recommended the Association to
apply for and have the Commission equip and
maintain an official fisheries over said dam.
The report also contained a statement that the
Commission forbade the fishing for perch, rooster
fish through the ice of Seneca Lake in winter
because said waters have been repeatedly
stocked, stocked, Brown lake having by the
said Commission & that such fishing was
therefore unlawful.

Die weitere duty made necessary the reparation
the Committee on Disarmament was received with thanks
and ordered to be placed on file.

Our motion by Mr. Wickes duly made, seconded,
carried the Secretary was requested to obtain
from the Commissioner at Albany the passage and
of establishing such a fishway.

On motion duly made by Pres. Fitzgerald
seconded by Mr. Wickes ^{unanimously} & carried, the President

was empowered by the association to
expend a sum not to exceed \$15⁰⁰ in
the removal of a dangerous reef of rocks,
to the south & near the west Bridge over
the causeway.

On motion duly made & carried the
minutes of this meeting were approved as read.

There being no further business, on
motion duly made & carried the meeting
then adjourned.
