

LAKE PROPERTY OWNERS' ASSOCIATION HELD AT "EDNET" LODGE
EAGLE LAKE, ESSEX CO., N.Y. ON SATURDAY AUG. 6TH 1932.

The 25th annual (silver jubilee) meeting of the Eagle Lake Property Owners' Association held on August 6th 1932 at "Ednet" Lodge, Eagle Lake, Essex Co. N.Y. was called to order by Vice Pres. Humphries at 3 P.M. Standard Time in pursuance to notices of the meeting having been sent to the members by mail in accordance with Art VIII. Sec 1. of the By-Laws of the Association.

The following members were present to witness this meeting, Miss Conran, Miss Humphries, Herty, ~~Long~~, McLean, Walker, Runge & Spalding, present in person. Mrs. Ward represented by Mr. Ward, Mrs. Keltie K. Runge by proxy to Walter Runge, Mrs. Lodge by proxy to Mrs. Humphries, Miss. Fitzgerald, Ford & Robins by proxy to E.O. Herty being a total enrollment of 12 members which constituted a quorum.

The minutes of the meeting held on Aug 2nd 1931 were approved as read.

A copy of our letter of objection dated Aug 1/31 sent by special messenger to the Water Power & Control Commission at Albany N.Y. to appear at the hearing to be held on Aug 3/31 in Glens Falls was read & ordered to be made a part of these minutes.

A letter & brief dated Aug 19/31, being a copy of the Revision of the Water Power & Control Commission known as Application # 638 for water power at the T. H. Johnson Dam on the St. Regis River.

Attention of Mr. Suter.

Gentlemen:-

At the annual meeting of the Eagle Lake Property-owner's Association held on August first, 1931 there came up for discussion the question of the possible effect on Eagle Lake of taking Gooseneck Pond as a source of water-supply for the Town of Ticonderoga, N.Y.

Gooseneck Pond shunts into Eagle Lake and at times during the year contributes to Eagle Lake a large supply of water. This occurs not only in the spring and fall but also after heavy rains during the summer. If this supply is entirely cut off by taking the water of Gooseneck Pond for the Town of Ticonderoga it is feared it may seriously affect the water-level of Eagle Lake.

This might leave our riparian structures at an inconvenient height, expose the spawning-beds of the fish in the shallower reaches of the lake and damage its scenic beauty generally.

We are not objectors to the plan of a necessary water-service for the Town of Ticonderoga--- on the contrary, we welcome and urge it and the advancement of Ticonderoga and all this section--- but we ~~wish~~ believe your Commission can embody in its decisions, on the application of the Town of Ticonderoga for the approval of its engineering plans, reasonable and proper methods so that Ticonderoga can have its water-supply and at the same time preserve the beauty of Eagle Lake and leave the rights of its riparian owners undisturbed.

This lake has been for many years the summer home of people from Ticonderoga, Albany, Troy, Schenectady, New York City and environments, Philadelphia, Buffalo, Boston, Cincinnati, Chicago, Santa Barbara and other distant cities and places. There are located on its borders about twenty-five summer homes.

It is a lake almost unrivalled in beauty and our Property-owners' Association is solicitous that nothing be done to diminish its attractiveness, ~~popularity~~ and present satisfactory character as a place for summer sojourning, which in the end will injure the Town and the Village of Ticonderoga.

The undersigned, appointed as a Committee at the said annual meeting of the Eagle Lake Property-owners' Association-- not as objectors but as co-operators in all that is best for this whole section--- bring this matter to the attention of the Water Power and Control Commission so that proper provision can be made now and future expense obviated.

a letter & brief dated Nov. 27/31 being
an amended decision of the Appellate Commission
in Re - Wm. G. T. L. concerning a application
A 638 for a water supply from Government
pond was also received & ordered filed.

A letter dated Feb. 8/32 from the N.Y. State
Fish Game & Forest League advising of their
establishment of a fiscal year from Dec
1st to Nov. 30th was received & filed.

A letter dated March 14/32 from the Conservation
Commission acknowledging receipt of our
application for bass & large perch stock for
Lega Lake & for brook trout for various brooks
at Chilson was received & ordered filed.

Under reports of officers the written annual
financial report of the Society Rec'd. was then
presented, no motion made & carried it
was accepted ^{& approved} as read & ordered filed.
Under reports of Committees, the Special
Committee on Road Signs reported that their
request for "Slow" Signs on the Highway had
been fulfilled.

No motion made & carried the Special Committee
on the Government Water Supply consisting of Messrs.
Sickles, Spalding, Humphries & Cutley, as a
Temporary Committee was continued as a
Permanent Committee with authority to act
in protection of the riparian rights of the
property owners in the event the water level
is raised but is nominally disturbed.

No resolutions were offered.

No applications for new members were presented.

Under New Business the matter of a possible lower water level in Eagle Lake that might be caused by the withdrawal of water from Goosefoot Pond, to which consideration was discussed and the Special Committee - Miss Spalding, Wickes, Humphries & Hartley were vested with authority to act for the protection of the riparian rights of the property owners, & to devise ways & means for retaining the necessary level of water in Eagle Lake by dams or otherwise.

A complaint lodged by Mrs. Harris protesting against the noise caused by outboard motors plying the waters of Eagle Lake was presented & docketed filed.

No further business being offered the meeting then adjourned.
