

LAKE PROPERTY OWNERS' ASSOCIATION, HELD AT "EDNET" LODGE,
EAGLE LAKE, ESSEX CO., N.Y., ON SATURDAY, AUGUST 5TH 1933.

The 26th Annual Meeting of the Eagle Lake Property Owners' Assn held on Saturday Aug. 5th 1933 at "Ednet" Lodge, Eagle Lake, Essex Co., N.Y. was called to order by Mr. Eliot Spalding as Chairman pro tem in the absence of both the Pres't & Vice Pres't. at 3 P.M. Standard Time, in pursuance to notices of this meeting having been mailed to the members in accordance with ART. VIII. SEC. I. of the By-Laws of the Association.

The following members were present to witness Mess. Eliot Spalding, Danes, Lutty, Mrs. Cecile K. Runge, Miss Cowan, Mrs. Herod represented by Mr. Herod in person and Mess. Fitzgerald, Ford, Lodge, McNeal, & Rakes, by Proxy to Mrs. Leetby, being a total enrollment of 12 members which constituted a quorum.

The minutes of the meeting held on Aug 6 1932 were approved as read.

Under communications the Sec'y reported that in the questionnaire sent to the members on the proposed ^{experimental} Plan of the N.Y. State Conservation Commission to Stock Eagle Lake with minnows 10 replies were in favor (Spalding, Herod, Wickes, Lutty, Danes, Lodge, Rakes, Rodgers, Mrs. Cecile Runge & W.L. Harris), 7 did not respond (Ward, Ford, Pond, Fitzgerald, McNeal, Mrs. Dawson & Miss Cowan) 2 were neutral (Runge & Humphries) total 19.

The Sec'y then read the voluminous correspondence with the Director & Chief Biologist of the N.Y. State Conservation Commission on their proposed Plan of an experimental Stocking of minnows in Eagle Lake for improving the fishing conditions which was also called to letters & manuscripts & blue prints from the District of Fish Research of the University of Michigan advocating placing of brush shelters along the shore of Eagle Lake, as a device for providing protection & shelter of minnows & bass fingerlings so as to increase the fishing. On motion made & carried the correspondence & the manuscripts & blue prints were received as a report of the Committee of Fisheries & the same were ordered filed.

From this report it developed upon a re-survey made by the Ass't. Biologist of the waters of Eagle Lake that these waters contained an ample supply of the proper minnows & food fishes for the predatory fish in the lake & the suggested experimental planting of minnows was considered unnecessary; however, upon motion made & carried the members agreed to provide on their shore line brush shelters as were suggested.

A letter from the Conservator of the Tiadaghton State Park requesting that our savings fund in the bank be

the Secty's reply stating he had no authority to do this without consent of the members & as no meeting could be called until August the motion would have to be deferred until then. In the meantime the Park reorganized its affairs so as to continue on the unrestricted basis. Our motion made & carried this item was ordered filed.

Acknowledgment from the State Conservation Commission of applications for pass for large lake & for brook trout for the Chilom brooks was received & ordered filed.

Receipt for our annual dues paid the N.Y. State Game, Fish & Game League for the yr. 1933 was received & ordered filed.

Under reports of officers the written annual financial report of the Secty. Treas showing balances on hand for the fiscal years business was presented & upon motion made & unanimously carried it was accepted, approved as read & ordered filed.

No resolutions were offered.
