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Corrie,

There has not been any trapping in the last few months but as of yesterday new traps were placed to try to get rid of the beaver prior to the lake freezing. We are doing our best to keep up with beaver activity. I have attached pictures of some before and after work that has been completed every couple days over the last few weeks. A question came up from the trapper about placing traps near the Eagle Lake water level control dam. The "Short Swing Trail" crosses the outflow at our dam so we were previously told not to trap within 150' of the trail. Is there an exception for a situation like this if proper warnings were posted? In talking to various trappers, some work for DEC under contract. Would there be a possibility of DEC assisting in this area? Our lake association is trying to manage the best we can but volunteer time and donations to cover trapping costs may not be enough at some point. We will get the report finished and out to you shortly. Thank you for the list of names.
