

Established in 1907 and incorporated in 1993, ELPOI is a not-for-profit organization that serves to protect and maintain the environmental and recreational quality of Eagle Lake for all users. As a volunteer organization, ELPOI relies heavily on its membership, governmental agencies and various grant opportunities to assist us in supporting these goals.

Grant Proposal

This grant application seeks funding to help support ELPOI's continuing efforts in monitoring, documenting and maintaining the water quality of Eagle Lake, which is located in the Towns of Ticonderoga and Crown Point.

- 1.) To help ELPOI cover the cost that has been imposed upon us for the continued test monitoring of Eagle Lake waters in conjunction with the NYS CSLAP (Citizens State Lake Assessment Program) and NYS FOLA (Federation of Lakes Association). This is a volunteer program in which lay citizens perform the collection of lake water samples over a 12-week summer period for the testing, analysis and reporting at NYS DEC facilities. In prior years, this program was offered at no charge. Due to budget constraints at the NYS DEC, continued participation in this program requires a cost deferral payment. The members of ELPOI complete supplemental water testing for Fecal and chemical analysis not covered in the CSLAP testing program. Both test analysis provide for a good picture of the current health of the lake and will hopefully provide advance warning to problems before they become major items.
- 2.) Having recently received a New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) Invasive Species Eradication Grant, ELPOI is preparing for a summer 2007 through 2010 Milfoil Eradication Project. As part of this project, the NYS DEC and the Adirondack Park Agency (APA) will require two comprehensive aquatic plant surveys. These surveys will need to be completed pre and post eradication efforts. Both surveys will document the plants at some 100 plus sites, by utilizing a rake toss method to gather samples. Plant samples will be identified and counted, as well as prepared for archived storage. The full cost for one of these surveys is approximately \$8,000. Documentation of specific work site vegetation and progress made with milfoil removal will be gathered with the GPS unit and under water camera, which were purchased with previous International Paper Company Foundation Grants. This documentation will supplement a final report of the success of the Invasive Species Eradication Grant.
- 3.) To help cover the mailing and web page hosting costs for ongoing education communications with the members of ELPOI and the various local, state and national agencies that help with the management of Eagle Lake. Approximately 50% of the ELPOI membership has access to the Internet, and ELPOI maintains an active and up-to-date e-mail list of these people. In addition, all of the people that work at the local, state and national agencies have e-mail. In the fall of 2000, ELPOI established a web page at www.eaglelake1.org to better inform people of the actions that the corporation is involved in regarding lake management. This site gets regular hits as several of the pictures showing milfoils unchecked growth were taken by local lake resident Janie Stevens on Eagle Lake. The pictures are the "poster child" for showing what mature milfoil beds look like at many conferences. ELPOI communicates regularly with its' membership and all interested agency members about the happenings with regards to lake monitoring, etc. A copy of the February 2008 Eagle Lake Newsletter is attached for reference. Newsletter copying was courtesy of International Paper's Ticonderoga Mill.

Report on use of previous year's Foundation Grant

In 2007, funding from International Paper Company's Foundation Grant was used by ELPOI toward items 1 and 3 as described above. In addition, ten new milfoil buoy markers were constructed and placed in Eagle Lake this past summer. They were placed over milfoil patches that were considered significant in size and were in places where motorboat operation would cut the plants and cause a spread of the milfoil. These new buoys have solar powered lights on top to mark their locations at night. Lettering, lights and anchor materials were purchased with grant money provided by International Paper Company.

Dear Sir or Madam:

This letter is in response to your telephone request for a copy of your organization's determination letter. This letter will take the place of the copy you requested

Our records indicate that a determination letter issued in July of 1996 granted your organization exemption from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. That letter is still in effect.

Based on information subsequently submitted, we classified your organization as one that is not a private foundation within the meaning of section 509(a) of the Code because it is an organization described in sections 509(a)(1) and 170(b)(1)(A)(vi).

This classification was based on the assumption that your organization's operations would continue as stated in the application. If your organization's sources of support, or its character, method of operations, or purposes have changed, please let us know so we can consider the effect of the change on the exempt status and foundation status of your organization.

Your organization is required to file Form 990, Return of Organization Exempt from Income Tax, only if its gross receipts each year are normally more than \$25,000. If a return is required, it must be filed by the 15th day of the fifth month after the end of the organization's annual accounting period. The law imposes a penalty of \$20 a day, up to a maximum of \$10,000, when a return is filed late, unless there is reasonable cause for the delay.

All exempt organizations (unless specifically excluded) are liable for taxes under the Federal Insurance Contributions Act (social security taxes) on remuneration of \$100 or more paid to each employee during a calendar year. Your organization is not liable for the tax imposed under the Federal Unemployment Tax Act (FUTA).

Organizations that are not private foundations are not subject to the excise taxes under Chapter 42 of the Code. However, these organizations are not automatically exempt from other federal excise taxes.

Donors may deduct contributions to your organization as provided in section 170 of the Code. Bequests, legacies, devises, transfers, or gifts to your organization or for its use are deductible for federal estate and gift tax purposes if they meet the applicable provisions of sections 2055, 2106, and 2522 of the Code.

Your organization is not required to file federal income tax returns unless it is subject to the tax on unrelated business income under section 511 of the Code. If your organization is subject to this tax, it must file an income tax return on the Form 990-T, Exempt Organization Business Income Tax Return. In this letter, we are not determining whether any of your organization's present or proposed activities are unrelated trade or business as defined in section 513 of the Code.

The law requires you to make your organization's annual return available for public inspection without charge for three years after the due date of the return. You are also required to make available for public inspection a copy of your organization's exemption application, any supporting documents and the exemption letter to any individual who requests such documents in person or in writing. You can charge only a reasonable fee for reproduction and actual poetage costs for the copied materials. The law does not require you to provide copies of public inspection documents that are widely available, such as by posting them on the Internet (World Wide Web). You may be liable for a penalty of \$20 a day for each day you do not make these documents available for public inspection (up to a maximum of \$10,000 in the case of an annual return).

Because this letter could help resolve any questions about your organization's exempt status and foundation status, you should keep it with the organization's permanent records.
