Native Plants are the trees, shrubs, flowers, grasses, ferns, and other plants that have evolved in a particular area over thousands of years. Most native plants have natural forces at work to keep their spread in check. Non-natives, being out of their natural range, often don't have predators or diseases to keep them under control. Sometimes these plants spread and take over, becoming an invasive species.

By planting native plants, you can be sure you aren't planting an invasive species. Some non-native plants are safe to plant as well, but be sure you know which plants those are before you plant them. Not only will planting native plants provide food and cover for wildlife, but native plants need less additional water and nutrients because they are already adapted to our local conditions, which saves you money. They also take up nutrients and water through their roots, which helps keep extra nutrients from running off into nearby bodies of water.

There are too many plants native to our area to list here. For selected lists of native plants that are good for rain gardens or shoreline buffers, check out some of our other publications. Or, for a lengthy list compiled by the Adirondack Park Agency of all plants that are native to the Adirondacks, you can go online to www.apa.state.ny.us/Research/MasterNativeListByHabitAlphaByCommonName.pdf.
